Olympian Lakshmikant Pandey was born in Koiripur Village, District Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. He proudly represented India in wrestling at the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games. He also won a medal at the 1956 National Wrestling Championship held at Patiala. Continuing his successful international career, he won the Silver Medal at the 1958 Commonwealth Games in Cardiff and the Bronze Medal at the 1962 Asian Games held in Jakarta. Through his achievements at the Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, and national level, Lakshmikant Pandey made a distinguished contribution to Indian wrestling and the sporting legacy of Uttar Pradesh.

DEBATE MOTION

The debate will be conducted on the fixed motion: “Judicial Independence in India: Reality or Constitutional Idea?”

2



CHOICE OF STAND

Each participant may choose to speak For or Against the motion and must clearly declare their stand before beginning their speech.

3



TIME LIMIT

Each participant will be allotted 6 minutes in total – 4 minutes to speak on the motion and 2 minutes to answer the question asked by the judges.

4



QUESTION BY JUDGES

Each participant will be asked one question by the judges based on their speech or the debate motion. The participant must answer within the allotted 2 minutes.

5



PRELIMINARY MEETINGS

A total of 10 preliminary meetings will be conducted – 5 meetings on 24 November and 5 meetings on 25 November.

PARTICIPANT SLOTS

Participants will be divided into slots of 25 participants each. The slot and meeting of each participant will be decided by the Organising Committee.

7



QUALIFICATION FOR FINALS

2 participants from each preliminary meeting will qualify for the Final Round. Therefore, a total of 20 participants will qualify.

8



FINAL ROUND

The Final Round will be conducted on 26 November, in which the 20 qualified participants will compete for the final rankings.

9



JUDGING CRITERIA

Participants will be evaluated on the basis of quality of arguments, subject knowledge, logical reasoning, clarity of presentation, rebuttal ability, response to the judge's question, and overall confidence.

SPEAKING ORDER

The speaking order will be determined by the Organising Committee and/or the judges.

TIME DISCIPLINE

The 4-minute speaking limit and 2-minute question-answer limit are strictly applicable. Exceeding the prescribed time may result in deduction of marks or termination of the response.

ONLINE PARTICIPATION

Participants must ensure a stable internet connection, working microphone and camera, and a suitable environment for participation.

13



LATE ENTRY

Participants must join their allotted meeting on time. Failure to do so may result in disqualification, unless otherwise permitted by the Organising Committee.

14



INDEPENDENT PARTICIPATION

Participants must participate independently. Assistance from another person, impersonation, or use of unfair means during the debate is strictly prohibited.

15



EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE

Participants may research and prepare beforehand, but the live debate must be delivered by the participant themselves. Any prohibited assistance during the live session may lead to disqualification.

NO INTERRUPTION

Participants must not interrupt or speak while others are speaking. Any interruption may lead to deduction of marks.

17



LANGUAGE

The debate must be conducted in clear, courteous and appropriate language. Use of abusive, defamatory or inappropriate language is strictly prohibited.

18



CONDUCT

Participants are expected to maintain decorum and uphold the dignity of the event. Any misconduct or unruly behaviour may lead to disqualification.

19



JUDGES' DECISION IS FINAL

The decision of the judges shall be final and binding. No queries or appeals regarding the scoring or results will be entertained.

20



TECHNICAL ISSUES

In case of any technical difficulties, participants must immediately inform the Organising Committee. The Committee's decision in such cases shall be final.

21



ORGANISER'S RIGHTS

The Organising Committee reserves the right to amend any rule or format if required, and their decision in all matters shall be final.
